Randolph Partnership for Children announces NC Pre-K application drop-off schedule

ASHEBORO, N.C. (April 28, 2020) — Randolph County Partnership for Children will accept applications in person for the NC Pre-K Program on Thursday, May 14 from 2-4 p.m.; Friday, May 15 from 10 a.m.-noon, and Tuesday, May 19, from 4-6 p.m.

The application drop-off will be a drive-through at the Partnership's office at 349 Sunset Ave., Asheboro, NC. Families dropping off applications must stay in their cars. Partnership staff will accept applications and make copies as necessary while maintaining safe social-distancing guidelines.



NC Pre-K is a free preschool program for children who may otherwise not have access to the preschool experiences. It's a part-day, curriculum-based program that enhances cognitive, social, and emotional growth in preparation for elementary school. The program serves children who are 4 years old by August 31 and meet one of the following three criteria:

- Family income is at or below 75% of the State Median Income (SMI)
- Child diagnosed with a special need
- Parent actively serving in the military and called to active duty within the past 18 months or who was seriously injured or killed while on active duty

There are five NC Pre-K sites in Asheboro, one in Level Cross, one in Liberty, one in Ramseur, one in Randleman, and two in the Archdale/Trinity area.

The Partnership will continue to accept applications through mail and email, as well.
