



## **Art Explosion**









Artwork created by infants, toddlers, and preschoolers will be on display in the windows of downtown Asheboro businesses throughout the month of April in celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Week of the Young Child, April 12-17 this year.

The Week of the Young Child is an annual celebration coordinated by the National Association for the Education of Young Children, which is nearly 100,000 members strong and includes a network of more than 300 local, state, and regional affiliates.

Participating centers in this year's Art Explosing include First Church of God Day School, First Presbyterian Preschool, First United Methodist Preschool, Harmony Place, My Circle of Friends Enrichment Center, Noah's Ark Playschool, Precious Memories Preschool, Shepherd's Way Day School, Teddy Bear Child Care Center, The Growing Place Child Care Center, The Children's Center of Asheboro, Trin-Dale Children's Center, and Victory Baptist Child Development Center.

Art Explosion encourages the creativity and self expression of our local

children. Partnership staff and volunteers mount and organize the art, then hang it in the windows of participating local businesses. Once the artwork is up, downtown is transformed into a month-long outdoor art gallery for everyone to enjoy!
