Each year, it's celebrated near the end of June. This year, we celebrate on Tuesday, June 29.

There are lots of ways you can celebrate. The best way to begin is to, of course, make mud by adding water to dirt.

Don't be afraid to bring or make mud inside, too. And don't be afraid to get nice and dirty.

Build, paint, and 'bake" with mud. Splatter it, spread it, and add to it.

Mud Sundae

Ingredients:

Dirt

Water

Sand

Rosemary or Lavender

Sand

Sticks

A Rock

Directions:

Add enough water to your dirt to get a very thick mud.
Scoop two heaping spoonfuls into a bowl-like container.
Sprinkle some sand on top.
Sprinkle some rosemary leaves or lavender leaves or flowers on top.
Add a stick or two for garnish.
Place a rock on top for a final touch
