Band-NC Digital Connectivity (\$5000) for hardware to enable families in need to connect to online resources, school, and more.



RPC Takes On Books for Babies

After four years as administrator of the Randolph Books for Babies program, the Friends of the Library and Dr. Frances Jones have passed the torch to Randolph Partnership for Children. As of August 1, Books for Babies will continue under RPC's umbrella of early literacy programs.

RPC was heavily involved in the program since its inception, making it a natural fit and easy transition. Each year, bags with books, literacy and new parent information, a locally handcrafted baby blanket, and baby's first library card are given to the 700-800 families of babies born at Randolph Health.





Imagination Library Enrollment Holds Steady
