Early Literacy Updates

Books for Babies

We've provided Randolph Health with **390** Books for Babies bags during the 2021-22 fiscal year, which included 780 books. Randolph Health reports 652 babies born during the 2021-22 fiscal year, so combined with bags they already had on site, about 1300 books were distributed through this program.



Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

We continue to encourage all families with infants, toddlers, and preschoolers to register. We ended the 2021-22 fiscal year with **4245** children enrolled, or about **53%** of the eligible population in Randolph County.

Reach Out and Read

We currently administer Reach Out and Read through partnerships with Asheboro Children's Health, Randolph Health Pediatrics, and Randolph Health-Liberty. These three sites distributed **2334 English** and **1080 Bilingual/Spanish** books to children at well-child visits during the 2021-22 fiscal year.
