Important Update to Our NC

Pre-K Acceptance Process



We're making some updates to our NC Pre-K acceptance process to ensure that every child has the best opportunity to benefit from the program. Here's what you need to know about the new changes taking effect this year:

Starting April 16th, we'll begin placing children in our NC Pre-K program for the upcoming school year. To be considered in this first round of placements, please make sure your application is submitted by April 15th. Placement will initially focus on priority status, with income eligibility taking the forefront. This means families meeting the income eligibility criteria will be considered first for placement.

For our little ones who might not meet income eligibility but bring diversity to our classrooms through other qualifying factors (such as children with disabilities/delays, chronic health conditions, military family children, or those with English as a second language) we won't forget you! Applications for this second round of placements need to be in by June 15th.

We understand life doesn't always stick to a schedule, so we'll continue to accept applications throughout the year. Qualifying applications submitted after June 15th will be placed based on slot availability.

Let's look forward to a school year of making new friends and learning new concepts!




March 21 - Gardening Basics
